
Behind Bars

Trial Monitoring

In October, at least 33 journalists stood trial in 17 hearings, 12 of which were adjourned. Three journalists were sentenced to prison, while one was acquitted. Most faced defamation and terrorism related charges.



Press Freedom Newsroom

Journalist Hakan Tosun was killed.

A draft bill risking criminalisation of LGBTQ+ reporting was introduced.

Tosun was assaulted by individuals with unknown motives, and questions about his murder remain unanswered. Read <u>our statement</u> for details.
